

Billina R. Shaw, MD, FAPA

Dr. Billina Shaw is currently the Medical Director of Mental Health Services at the Prince George's County Health Department. She is a board certified child, adolescent, and adult psychiatrist. At the Health Department, she works at the Behavioral Health clinic providing mental health and addictions treatment. In addition to roles related to the strategic planning for behavioral health services for the County, she also serves on the Prince George's County Drug Overdose Fatality Review Team, is also appointed to the Adult Public Guardianship Review Board and is a committee leader on the Behavioral Health Advisory Group.

Dr. Shaw attended Yale University for her undergraduate studies. She graduated with distinction in the psychology major while completing her premedical studies. She then attended the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine. In 2007, she moved to Baltimore for her general adult psychiatry residency and child and adolescent psychiatry fellowship at the University of Maryland/Sheppard Pratt where she served as Chief Resident of the Psychiatric Emergency Services and Chief Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Ambulatory Services Fellow.

While in training, she received numerous awards for cultural competence and was an American Psychiatric Association (APA) Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) Fellow. She used the stipend to spend one month in Kenya educating HIV/AIDS providers on mental health in addition to other projects. She also has participated in the planning of the University of Maryland Cultural Diversity Day for several years and served as Co-Chair one year.

Dr. Shaw later joined the faculty of the University of Maryland School of Medicine and provided mobile psychiatric treatment to children and adolescents in Baltimore City. She also taught lectures and provided clinical supervision to many psychiatric residents and fellows. In 2016, Dr. Shaw moved to Prince George's County and she served as the Medical Director of an outpatient mental health center in Landover, Maryland before joining the Health Department.

Dr. Shaw has been the Ministry Head for her health ministry at her local church and serves on the board of a prison prevention non-profit.

A faculty member in the Department of Psychiatry since 1989, Dr. Jill RachBeisel is the Vice Chair for Clinical Affairs who has provided clinical, teaching, research collaboration, and administrative leadership over the past 24 years. A graduate of the Pennsylvania State University School of Medicine where she received her medical degree and then the University of Maryland Medical System Psychiatric Residency, Dr. Rachbeisel began her career in the field of acute psychiatric care, emergency psychiatric interventions and quality management in the hospital setting. From 7/1/99 thru 6/30 2016 she then served as the Division Director for Community Psychiatry at the University of Maryland. For the past 7 years she has provided oversight, including program development & Performance Improvement, of all clinical services in the Department of Psychiatry. She is actively involved in understanding the impact of Population Health Management on persons with SMI as well as mental health issues in complex medical/surgical conditions.

In addition to her career long dedication to serving the seriously and persistently mentally ill, Dr. RachBeisel has developed interests in Women's Mental Health ,Attention Deficit Disorder in Adults, the implementation of Evidenced-Based Clinical Practices in clinical programs including Illness Management and Recovery for the SMI population, Family involvement and the management of Substance Use Disorders in the face of Mental Illness.
